What is HenPower?

HenPower brings together hen-keeping and creativity, offering older people opportunities to build relationships with others.

Actively engaging older people in the care of hens, is a positive distraction providing a catalyst for lively creative activities from singing and poetry to visual arts, horticulture and textiles.

A 12-month study by Northumbria University found HenPower:

- Significantly improves the health and wellbeing of older people
- Reduces loneliness and depression among older people

Choosing to HenPower your care setting can:

- Support relationship centred care between older people, staff, families, visitors and the wider community
- Inspire residents, relatives and care staff to be aspirational in providing meaningful creative activities
- Encourage partnerships with the wider community and groups like school children, people with disabilities, students, local history groups, arts events and festivals
- Provide care staff with excellent skills transfer and professional development opportunities









Research increasingly highlights how encouraging people living with dementia to take part in creative activities significantly enriches and improves their quality of life, helping many to live well with their condition.

Creativity doesn't fade as we age. It provides an opportunity for people to live in the moment and express themselves through art, exploring new interests or perfecting past potential.

Guidelines from the National Institute of Clinical Excellence (NICE) now recommend group based activities focusing on creativity to improve the mental wellbeing of older people and prolonging active life.

The Care Quality Commission's Chief Inspector of Adult Social Care, Andrea Sutcliffe states, "Creativity and innovation are key ingredients in 'Outstanding' care homes."

Our HenPowered homes benefit from regular creative sessions with professional artists delivering a variety of activities.





HenPowering your care home

£500 from the host venue contributes to the pilot costs and includes a hen house, hens and the basic equipment to get your residents started.

We'll help you identify the best spot for your flock and establish hen-keeping as an enjoyable part of residents' daily routines, whilst offering a range of creative and meaningful activities for residents.

We'll give support to establish a Resident and Relative Group, to ensure quality of life activities and creativity on an ongoing basis and will offer guidance and support with fundraising.

Following a successful pilot, an annual membership fee of £500 provides:

- Online training for care staff
- 'How To' guides providing ideas for creative sessions
- Informative news and updates on HenPower projects around the world
- Support and guidance from HenPower staff and peers via our members only online community
